





An afternoon with Barbara Nadel and Janice Hallett in conversation with Tom Mead Sunday 4 May • 2.30 – 4pm

After the war, she was demobbed as one of the most highly decorated women in Polish history. Yet her remarkable story remained hidden for over forty years.






