TRAINING LINK GOVERNORS' MEETING THURSDAY 22 SEPTEMBER 2011

Sarah Beaumont, Governor Services Manager, welcomed everyone to the meeting. She explained that a Training Link Governor (formerly known as the Link Governor) was the link between the Local Authority and the Governing Body, overseeing the training and development of their governors.

She explained that the purpose of the termly Link Governor's meeting was to provide information on forthcoming governor training and development events and to give an opportunity for Link Governors to meet together and discuss current issues.

PRESENTATION: SCHOOL GOVERNOR ONE STOP SHOP (SGOSS)

'School Governor One Stop Shop' (SGOSS) was launched in 1999 with the aim of encouraging people with transferable skills to volunteer as governors in schools facing the greatest challenges. Since its launch, SGOSS has recruited and helped place more than 10,000 volunteers in schools across England. SGOSS works in partnership with Local Authorities and its services are free to Local Authorities, schools, volunteers and employers.

Heather O'Donnell, Area Manager, gave a presentation (attached) about how schools can benefit from working with SGOSS to recruit governors.

Recruiting school governors



Who are we?



- •School Governors' One-Stop Shop (SGOSS) is a national charity set up in 2000 to recruit volunteers with transferable business skills to become school governors.
- •Since its launch, SGOSS has recruited and helped place more than 10,000 volunteers in schools across England.
- •We are funded by the Department for Education (DfE) and other trustees.

What do we do?



- •In total there are around 300,000 governor places in 21,400 schools throughout England and at any one time, more than 40,000 of these places are vacant.
- •We work with any school, nursery, college or Local Authority that has governor vacancies.
- Our services are completely free to everyone involved.
- •We recruit skilled volunteers by working with a wide range of different companies.
- •We can help find volunteers for your community governor vacancies.
- We can also help with associate member positions, sponsor, foundation, partnership and to some extent, parent governor vacancies.








•We have a number of Barnet volunteers on our database, and there are many others from neighbouring Harrow, Brent, Camden, Haringey and Enfield who would be willing to volunteer in a Barnet school.

How does it work?



- •All you need to do is register your governor vacancies at www.sgoss.org.uk/schools. You can specify any particular skills or experience that you require.
- •We will then search our database to see if we have any suitable volunteers. If we don't, we will advertise your vacancy in the local community using our media and business contacts.
- •Once we have found a suitable volunteer/s, we will be in touch providing their details for your consideration.



What happens next?



- •If they're suitable, contact the volunteer/s as soon as possible to arrange a meeting, even if your next GB meeting isn't for a couple of months.
- •Keep us updated on any progress.
- •Let us know if you appoint our volunteer/s or if you fill the vacancy yourselves.

Parent governor vacancies



- •We can provide downloadable resources.
- •If this doesn't work...
 - 7. Schools must make every reasonable effort to fill parent governor vacancies through elections. If insufficient parents stand for election the governing body can appoint:

a parent of a registered pupil at the school, or a parent of a former pupil at the school, or a parent of a child of, or under, compulsory school age.

This also applies to community special schools and foundation special schools, but for these schools the appointment criteria are:

a parent of a registered pupil at the school, or a parent of a former pupil at the school, or

a parent of a child of or under compulsory school age with special educational needs for which the school is approved, or

a parent with experience of educating a child with special educational needs.
