Contextual safeguarding is key to safeguarding children around these place on the high street and greater security such as CCTV in and around these shops would also be beneficial.
I believe a greater distance of fast food outlets from school will not only contribute to better health but provide better safeguarding opportunities for children to keep them away from exploitation and entry to the youth justice system.
